Gulag: 1934—1956; As of 1953 more than 2.4 million people were imprisoned; more than 465,000 were political prisoners












Russian Ambassador to the UN Security Council presided over the meeting of the Security Council just minutes after President Putin declared a war on Ukraine.





# The ICC is an independent judiciary, and its design doesn't threaten sovereignty of the states





- Principle of Complementarity grants the states the primary right to investigate and prosecute the crimes within the ICC's jurisdiction
- The ICC has jurisdiction over a case only if no state is genuinely investigating or prosecuting that case or has done so:
  - the state is unwilling or unable genuinely to investigate and to prosecute
  - Sufficient gravity criteria

## Office of the Prosecutor has jurisdiction over a case based on:

- Subject-matter jurisdiction:
  - War crimes
  - Crimes against humanity
  - Genocide
- Territoriality and nationality principles
- Scale and gravity of the crimes
- Analysis of the ability of the national judiciary and domestic legislation

### As of June 27, 2022

- OHCHR: 10,631 civilian casualties in the country: 4,731 killed and 5,900 injured.
- WHO: 500 attacks were committed on health centers; 334 attacks impacted facilities; 59 attacks impacted patients; 94 attacks impacted medical transport and 164 attacks impacted medical personnel.

April 24, 2014, Initial Ad Hoc Declaration

Sept. 8, 2015, Second Declaration, Extension from Feb. 20, 2014 onward

Dec. 11, 2020, Conclusion of the preliminary examination on the situation in Ukraine

Feb. 28, 2022 Decision to seek authorization to open investigation into the Situation in Ukraine



OTP received referrals of the Situation in Ukraine from the 39 ICC States Parties and openined an investigation

2 Mar. 2022

ICC Office of the Prosecutor has become a participant in the Joint Investigation Team (JIT) on alleged core international crimes committed in Ukraine

25 Apr.

#### 25 Mar. 2022

Joint Investigation Team under the auspices of Eurojust was set up by Lithuania, Poland and Ukraine; later joined by Estonia, Latvia, Slovakia

#### **17 May**

ICC deployed a team of 42 investigators, forensic experts and support personnel to Ukraine, the largest in the organization's history.
